

Heading south from Hawke's Bay takes you through lush farmland, native bush and forest parks of the Tararua region, a rural haven rich in Scandinavian heritage. Let the huge wind turbines of the Tararua Wind farm guide you onto the vine-lined plains of the Wairarapa.

Pukaha, National Wildlife Centre

Pukaha, National Wildlife Centre is New Zealand's centre for conservation breeding for a number of threatened species including kiwi. You can see kiwi in the kiwi house and walk in with the wildlife in the free flight aviary.
